

Vedanta Aluminium Transforms Last-Mile Healthcare in Kalahandi and Rayagada, Benefiting Over 65,000 People

Bhubaneswar : Vedanta Aluminium, India's largest producer of aluminium, is strengthening rural healthcare delivery in Odisha through its Mobile Health Unit (MHU) initiative, aimed at improving access to primary healthcare in underserved regions. In FY26, the company delivered free healthcare services to 65,000 patients across 126 villages, including 35 villages in Rayagada, 31 villages in Sijimali and 60 villages in Kalahandi. Mobile Health Units (MHUs) are specially designed vehicles that deliver essential healthcare services directly to communities, particularly in remote, rural, and underserved areas where access to hospitals and clinics is limited. Demonstrating its continued commitment to community healthcare, the company has also organized 11 multispecialty health camps benefiting 1,949 patients across 51 villages.
